#### TREE, DEBRIS OR DERELICT DOCK REMOVAL INSTRUCTIONS AND CHECKLIST

FirstLight Power Resources (FirstLight) holds a license from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC") for Housatonic River Project No. 2576 (the "Project"). As a condition of its license to generate power, Housatonic River Project License P-2576 (Project License), FirstLight has an obligation to permit uses and occupancies of Project lands and waters. This area is delineated by a geographic boundary (Project boundary) which is defined in Exhibit G of the License. Article 413 of the Project License requires FirstLight to regulate the non-project use and occupancies within the Project boundary. Non-project uses and occupancies must be consistent with the purposes of protecting and enhancing the scenic, recreational, and other environmental values of the project. To that end, FirstLight submitted a Shoreline Management Plan ("SMP"), which was approved by the FERC on March 27, 2013; with subsequent FERC approval of the Vegetated Buffer Plan on November 17, 2014 and approval of the Boat Overcrowding Plan on November 20, 2014. The Non-Conforming Structure Report for the Rocky River development, Candlewood Lake, was approved by the FERC on June 22, 2015. Permits are required for all existing shoreline uses and occupancies, as well as any proposed repairs, modifications or new uses.

<u>Tree(s)</u>: The removal of any trees or understory vegetation on FirstLight's lands and waters must be approved by FirstLight. Prior to considering the removal of a tree(s) Lake Residents should refer to the FirstLight's INFORMATIONAL SHEET: TREE ASSESSMENT AND WOODY DEBRIS FAQ and the CT DEEP's "Large Woody Debris Fact Sheet". The issuance of a Permit for vegetation removal may be subject to the establishment of a comprehensive plan and schedule to install a compliant vegetated buffer. FirstLight's Shoreline Management Manual, A Homeowner's Guide to Shoreline Stabilization and Vegetated Buffers provides guidance on Vegetated Buffer Zones and the preservation and enhancement of Vegetated Buffer Areas as required with in the Shoreline Management Plan.

<u>Debris</u>: FirstLight will endeavor to secure or remove fallen trees or other natural woody debris that has become dislodged from the shoreline. In the case of trees that have fallen and are impeding swimming or boating access of an abutting home owner, the home owner may apply for a permit to cut back the tree or to remove or relocate the trunk and limbs of the tree. For more information on fallen trees and large woody debris applicants should refer to FirstLight's INFORMATIONAL SHEET: TREE ASSESSMENT AND WOODY DEBRIS FAQ and the CT DEEP's "Large Woody Debris Fact Sheet".




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**Derelict Dock(s):** FirstLight will endeavor to secure, remove and/or dispose of derelict docks that break loose or cause a hazard to navigation. All entities shall be responsible for maintaining their docks in safe working condition. If a dock is removed or replaced, the old dock must be disposed of properly. If a derelict dock owner can be identified, they will be charged an enforcement fee plus the cost of recovering and disposing of the dock and may be subject to loss of a permit or enforcement fees if there is evidence the dock was purposefully released into the lake.

Applicants with Permit requests for all other uses should use FirstLight Permit: Shoreline Application Form for Non-Project Uses and Occupancies.



FirstLight will issue a Letter of Filing Consent (LOFC) for any requests requiring additional approvals from federal, state, or municipal agencies. This letter must be signed by the applicable agencies and returned to FirstLight, for final review and approval prior to the issuance of a FirstLight Permit

No activities may occur on lands and waters within the Project boundary without the final review and approval by FirstLight through the issuance of a Permit. Failure to obtain a Permit will result in FirstLight's exercise of its enforcement policies as defined in the SMP-Exhibit E.

# **Housatonic River Project FERC 2576** INFORMATIONAL SHEET

TREE ASSESSMENT AND WOODY DEBRIS FAQ (rev. 6-7-16)

**FirstLight Power Resources (FirstLight)** holds a license from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("**FERC**") for Housatonic River Project No. 2576 (the "**Project**"). As a condition of its license to generate power, **Housatonic River Project License P-2576 (Project License)**, FirstLight has an obligation to permit uses and occupancies of Project lands and waters. This area is delineated by a geographic boundary (**Project boundary**) which is defined in Exhibit G of the License. Article 413 of the Project License <u>requires</u> FirstLight to regulate the non-project use and occupancies within the Project boundary. Non-project uses and occupancies must be consistent with the purposes of protecting and enhancing the scenic, recreational, and other environmental values of the project. To that end, FirstLight submitted a **Shoreline Management Plan** ("**SMP**"), which was approved by the FERC on March 27, 2013; with subsequent FERC approval of the Vegetated Buffer Plan on November 17, 2014 and approval of the Boat Overcrowding Plan on November 20, 2014. The Non-Conforming Structure Report for the Rocky River development, Candlewood Lake, was approved by the FERC on June 22, 2015. Permits are required for all existing shoreline uses and occupancies, as well as any proposed repairs, modifications or new uses.

Within the SMP there is a requirement for the preservation and establishment of Vegetated Buffer Areas. The removal of trees and understory vegetation must be approved by FirstLight. This removal is usually considered under a comprehensive review of an application for non-project uses and occupancies. A native vegetation plan is an important component of that application. Abutting homeowners can refer to the **FirstLight's "Shoreline Management Manual, A Homeowner's Guide to Shoreline Stabilization and Vegetated Buffer Zones"** for additional information on vegetated buffers and developing a native vegetation plan. In the case of a tree(s) that are requested to be approved for removal because an abutting homeowner is concerned they may potentially present a substantial risk of injury or private property damage, a request for a permit may be made using the TREE, DEBRIS OR DERELICT DOCK REMOVAL REQUEST form. Under certain circumstances FirstLight will fall a tree that has been determined to be a substantial risk. FirstLight requires that this determination be based on a <u>Tree Risk Assessment</u> performed by a professional arborist licensed in the State of Connecticut.

#### Why should we have trees along the shoreline?

Trees along the shoreline provide many aesthetic, environmental and natural resource values including; providing cooling shade, habitat for both aquatic and terrestrial animal species, aiding in bank stability, intercepting rain, promoting rainwater infiltration and reducing soil erosion. Preserving mature trees, encouraging the regrowth of desirable saplings, and maintaining the native existing understory will help stabilize the shoreline and reduce the need for costly future bank stabilization projects. Even leaning trees along a shoreline can stabilize a shoreline.

#### When is a tree considered to present a substantial risk?

A CT Licensed Arborist has been trained to evaluate trees to assess whether they are dead or diseased and may provide recommendations based on that assessment. In some cases, recommendations may include fertilizing, irrigating and/or treating a tree with chemical, biological or mechanical control techniques with the goal of preserving the tree. Not all trees that are dead or diseased are unsafe or present a substantial risk. A tree has a radius area that could be impacted in the event of a falling trunk or limb. If this area is not regularly used by individuals, then there may be little reason to intervene. The determination of whether a tree potentially poses a substantial risk should be made as part of the contracted licensed arborist's assessment. FirstLight requires that an arborist written report and/or risk assessment be provided to FirstLight before a permit is issued for the removal of a tree. FirstLight will not permit the removal of trees simply because an abutting homeowner feels they are undesirable, such as with the dropping of leaves or interfering with views of the water.

#### Why not remove all dead trees and debris?

FirstLight maintains and encourages that their lands remain in a natural state. Unless a dead tree is determined to be unsafe, in most cases, FirstLight will not permit its removal. Removal of the tree may cause more disturbances to the soil, surrounding trees and understory vegetation than letting a tree fall on its own. Dead trees, like living trees, also perform an important function in an ecosystem. They provide habitat and a food source for many shoreline plant and animal species. Over time, the decay and decomposition of the tree is beneficial to the surrounding soils and ecosystem. Even if a tree is removed, leaving the trunk and limbs on the ground will provide benefits over time. In all cases where FirstLight determines that it will remove a tree, the trunk and the limbs will be left in the area of the tree removal on either FirstLight's lands and/or waters below the Project Boundary.

### If a tree is removed, why are stumps and roots not removed?

Even if a tree is removed, the roots of that tree will continue to provide stability to the shoreline for many years to come. Leaving the stump in place also will cause fewer disturbances to the surrounding trees and understory vegetation. FirstLight will not remove the stump and roots and may not issue a permit for their removal.

#### What about trees that have fallen in the water?

Trees that have fallen in the water provide many of the same benefits as trees that have fallen on the ground. Fallen trees provide a structure and habitat for fish, amphibians, birds, and macro-invertebrates as well as other species along the water's edge. In the case of trees that have fallen and are impeding swimming or boating access of an abutting home owner, the home owner may apply for a permit to cut back the tree or to remove or relocate the trunk and limbs of the tree. If a fallen tree has become dislodged from the shoreline and presents a navigational hazard, the appropriate lake authority and/or the CT DEEP should be contacted. The CT DEEP has created a document that discusses the benefits of woody material in a water course which is entitled "Large Woody Debris Fact Sheet"
